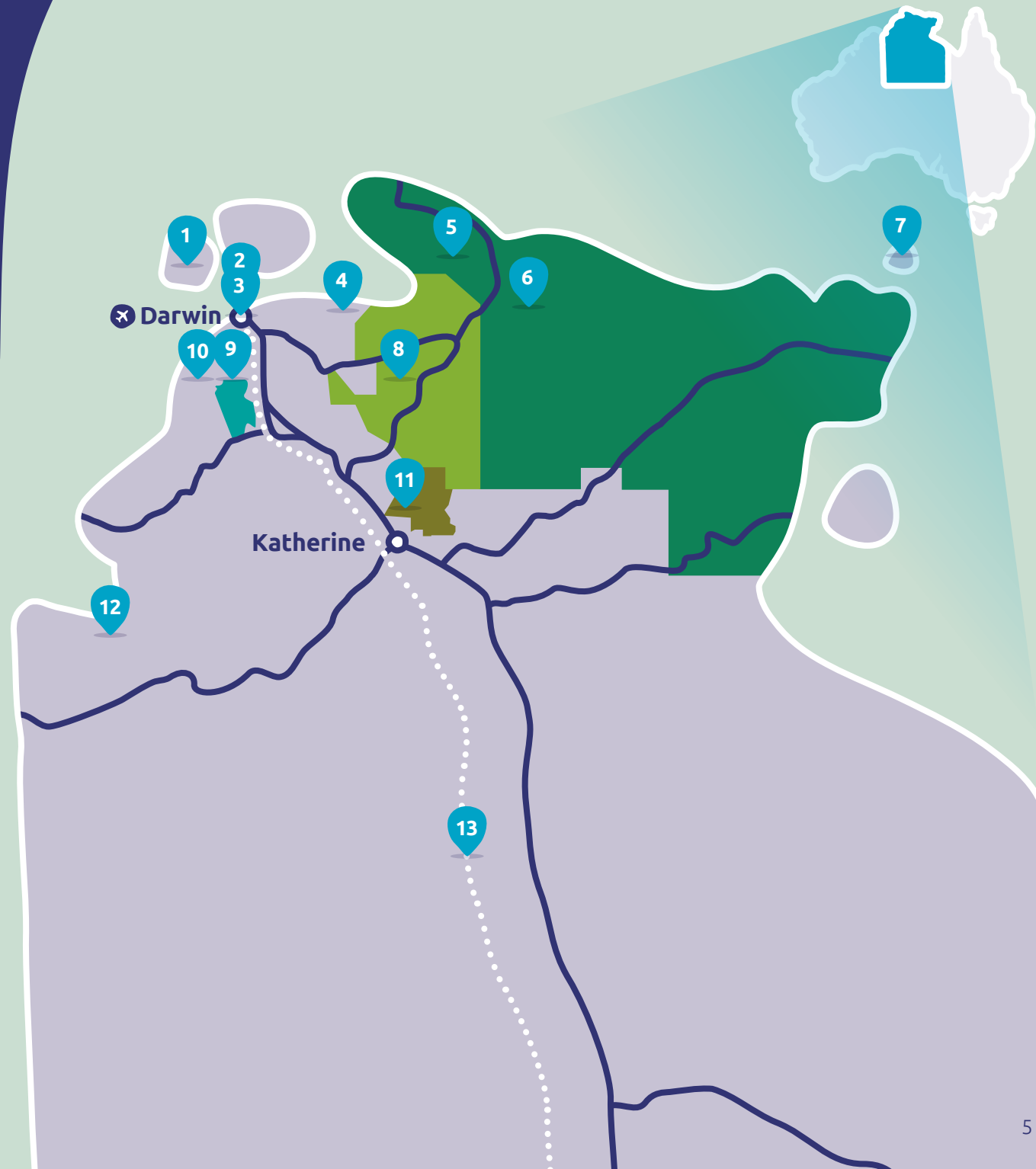

Guests travel by ferry from Darwin to Bathurst Island (Wurrumiyanga) then across the island by 4WD to meet a sea transfer to the remote beachfront Tiwi Island Retreat. Activities include fishing from the beach, relaxing by the pool, experiencing the Tiwi sunset, with canapés on the beach. In the evening a chef-prepared dinner is served on the deck.

The second day includes a tropical breakfast and transfer to Wurrumiyanga to experience Tiwi art and culture. Guests are welcomed with a smoking ceremony, have an opportunity to meet Tiwi artists, and are guided on a walking tour through the Patakitjyali Museum and Mission Precinct, before creating their own screen print souvenir. In the afternoon, guests will return to Darwin by ferry.

Mt Borradaile is a registered Aboriginal sacred site, entrusted by the Traditional Owners to the Davidson family and their highly trained guides to share with small visitor groups.

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# BanuBanu Beach Retreat

BanuBanu Beach Retreat allows guests to relax and unwind in one of Australia's most pristine places. This rustic eco-friendly retreat will satisfy the need for rest, culture and nature.

Banubanu is an eco-island beach retreat nestled into the sand dunes on the north tip of Bremer Island, between two pristine beaches and rocky headland. It is part of a greater arena of beautiful offshore islands in the Arafura Sea and is perfect for nature lovers, fishermen and guests who want to relax.

The retreats are made from local materials, some recovered from the island's beaches, to keep a low impact on the surroundings. Guests are accommodated comfortably with eco-friendly facilities that ensure Banubanu and the surrounding area remain in a pristine state.

Many guests agree that the very best experience comes from being able to relax in such a remote location. There is no internet or mobile phone coverage, from the retreat but it can be accessed from the highest sand dune if needed.



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# Yellow Water Villas

Yellow Water Villas are five luxury retreats in Cooina, in the heart of Kakadu National Park, adjacent to the region's most famous waterway, Yellow Water Billabong. Nestled under a rich canopy of trees, each of the Yellow Water Villas balances luxury with a commitment to environmental sustainability.

People, Planet, Profit is the strong ethos of Kakadu Tourism and the development of the new Yellow Water Villas demonstrates this spirit throughout. Built on stilts to minimise any impact to the land, not one tree was cut down to accommodate the retreats. The absolute preservation of the land was the key priority of the Traditional Owners.

The luxury Villas have a BBQ and private bathtub on the large veranda. The fully air-conditioned Villas boast a high-quality king size bed, ensuite bathroom, dining area and lounge area with daybeds. Each of the five retreats is named after an indigenous animal of the local Kakadu area, themed throughout with personal stories of the local communities throughout – from the pillows to the walls.

Located within the grounds of Cooina Lodge, guests have access to two restaurants a bar, two resort style swimming pools, a tour desk, retail shop, fuel service, and children's playing area.

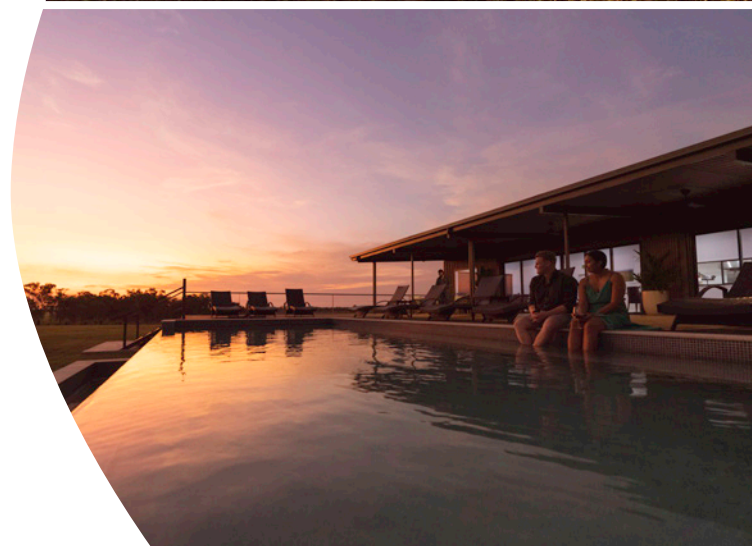
Secluded on the edge of vast wetlands, each of the lodge's 6 breathtaking rooms commands expansive views of nature and fiery sunsets.

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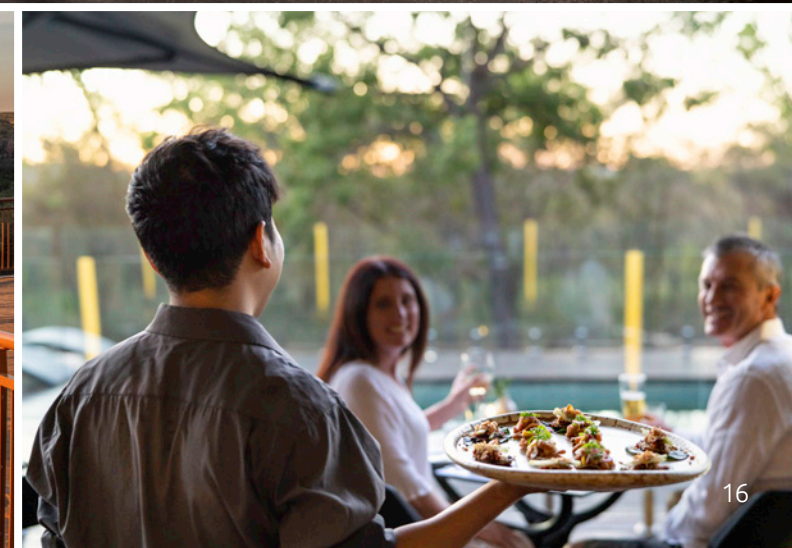
# Cicada Lodge / Nitmiluk Tours

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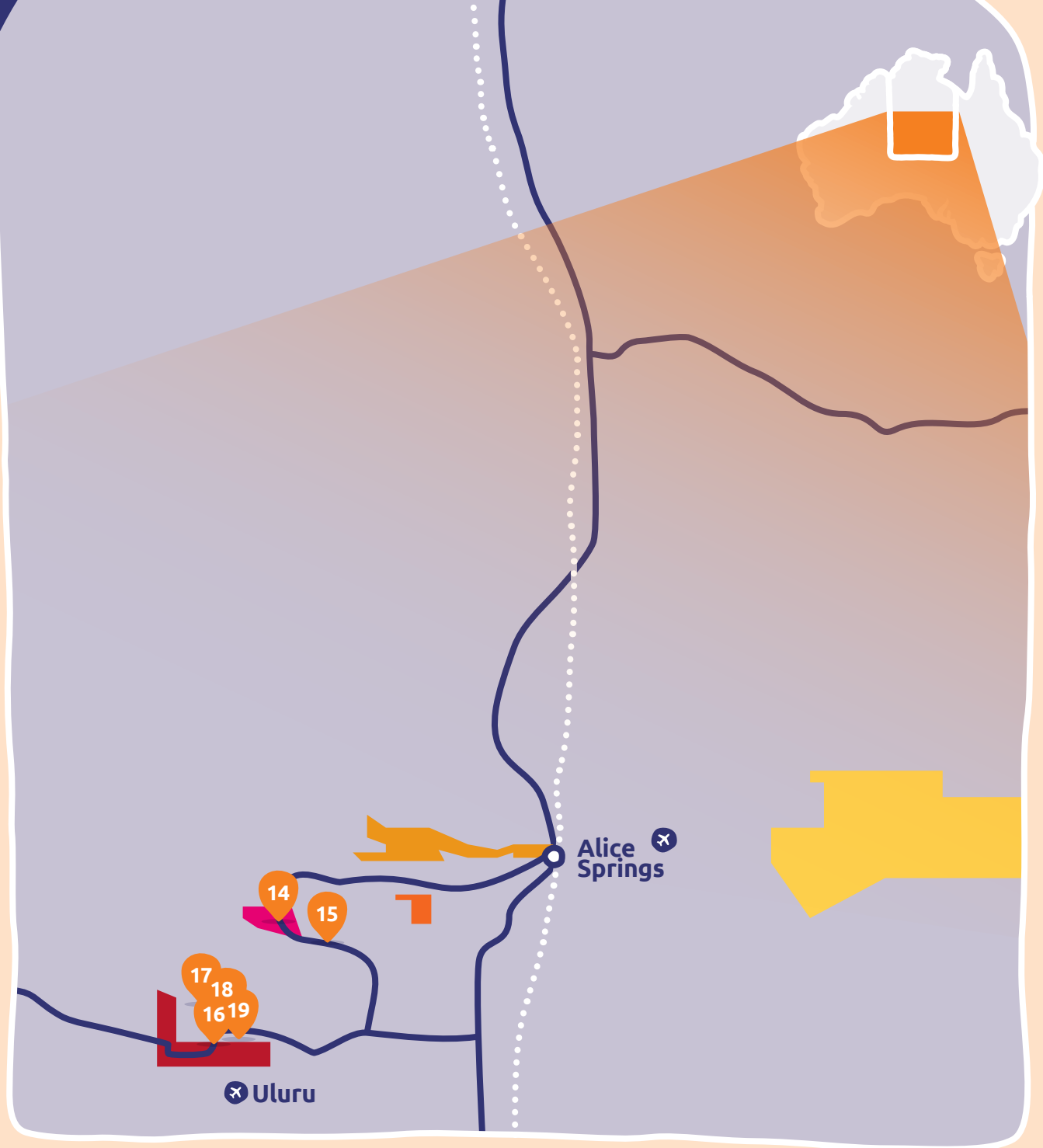

# Discovery Parks - Kings Canyon

The magnificent Kings Canyon is part of the Northern Territory's Watarrka National, around half-way between Alice Springs and the World Heritage-listed Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park. Kings Canyon Resort overlooks the canyon's towering sandstone cliffs and offers a range of accommodation including beautiful deluxe rooms featuring a private balcony and a luxurious bathtub, where guests can watch the escarpment light up as the day transforms into night. There are also standard rooms, glamping and a camping and caravanning park on offer.

Guests wake to peaceful birdsong and embark on a day filled with adventures, from scenic heli flights, a range of hikes exploring the spectacular outback landscape, and popular six kilometre Rim Walk which traces the Kings Canyon cliffs.

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# Wintjiri Wiru

Voyages Indigenous Tourism Australia bring a breathtaking, fully-immersive, light and sound show called Wintjiri Wiru. Meaning a 'beautiful view out to the horizon' in local Pitjantjatjara language, this is the first time a light, laser, projection and drone experience of this magnitude has been performed on a regular basis anywhere in the world. 1,100 drones depict a chapter of the ancient Mala story, from Kaltukatjara to Uluru.

Three experiences are available, from the Wintjiri Wiru Sunset Dinner which includes drinks and canapés on arrival and a gourmet dinner hamper, Wintjiri Wiru Twilight which includes refreshments and a cheese and dessert hamper, and Wintjiri Wiru After Dark which also includes refreshments and a cheese and dessert hamper, which has a later departure, which make it suitable for those wanting to dine at the resort beforehand.

Native Australian produce and Indigenous bush foods are the heroes of the culinary experience of Wintjiri Wiru, from lemon aspen and wattleseeds to quandong, warrigal greens and lemon myrtle. The menu for Wintjiri Wiru is an authentic celebration of native Australian ingredients.
